

Professional Technology Use

- What 'colour(s)' are you?

Students use computers in my classroom, mainly as a reward for "finishing early", or as part of rotated drill activities.

When my students go to the lab, they are working on a technology project developed by the RFF teacher.

(Yellow)

Students use computers in my classroom to publish word processing documents, and create slide-show presentations.

Students in my class can access online resources and recognise and "filter" relevant information.

Students in my class are able to incorporate information that they have found on the Internet in their project work.

RFF Lab projects are related to classroom projects.

(Blue)

My students go to the computer lab with an RFF teacher.

We rarely use computers in our classroom.

Use of technology doesn't make any difference to my students' results.

(Red)

My students and I publish new information on the school intranet.

We use the Intranet as a "gateway" to the Internet.

I publish resources for students online.

I am confident using a computer connected to a projector to present student projects and demonstrate ideas.

I can access professionally-related list-servs and online forums.

(Mauve)

I am interested in using ICT to support a classroom atmosphere that motivates my students.

I attend conferences/meetings to discover and share ideas about how teachers in other schools are using technology in the curriculum.

I have developed new classroom projects that involve students using ICT.

(Green)

My students use ICT as an integral (almost "invisible") part of their regular class projects.

Teachers from other schools visit my classroom to share ideas and to consider new ways of implementing ICT in their classrooms.

I create and share information & resources with other schools online.

(Berry)
